

## **Choose a Topic**

You may need to expand or narrow down your topic depending on how long your paper needs to be. Obviously, a shorter assignment deals with a more limited topic. Sometimes the topic is given to you; but if you have the freedom to choose, ask yourself these questions (Booth et al., 2008, p. 14):

### **What Do I Feel Passionate About?**

It is so much easier working on something you are genuinely interested in. Some lecturers will let you modify a given research question to fit in with your area of interest, so do not be afraid to suggest an alternative.

### **What Do I Want To Know?**

Anticipate what you might need to know for a future job or situation. Use this research opportunity to develop your knowledge and skills.

### **What Real-Life Issue Can I Explore?**

Explore an issue that has a real-life answer. This makes the research exciting, edgy, and meaningful.
